

2017 GLOBAL EVALUATION PLAN

Independent Evaluation Office

Background

UN Women recognizes evaluation as a key accountability and learning instrument to improve organizational effectiveness and efficiency. Over the course of the Strategic Plan (2014-2017), significant progress has been made in all key evaluation performance indicators. External assessments showed a considerable improvement in quality of evaluations¹ as well as increased use of evaluative evidence².

Majority of evaluations in UN Women are managed at decentralized levels. In view of this, UN Women continues to use the Monitoring, Research and Evaluation Plans (MERPs) to support strategic planning of evaluations to maximize the timeliness and use of evaluative information. This has considerably increased the topical and geographic coverage, as well as the credibility and quality of evaluations. The integrated approach also promoted the systematic use of evaluation results to inform programming, refining systems and business processes to improve organizational effectiveness and efficiency.

Nonetheless, the ever-growing body of evaluative evidence necessitates better coordination and synergy between corporate and decentralized evaluations. This is increasingly relevant to strengthen the effectiveness of the evaluation function by optimizing the use of resources and more importantly, increase the ability of UN Women to accelerate progress towards gender equality and the empowerment of women. In respect to evaluation planning, the Evaluation Policy requires:

- Evaluations to be planned, budgeted for, and implemented in a timely manner to inform new programming
- Mandatory development of an integrated MERP, an integral part of Strategic Notes
- Sufficient evaluation coverage of the office portfolio:
 - One-third of the overall office portfolio during the strategic note period should be evaluated
 - At least one country-level evaluation per country programme/plan life cycle
 - ✓ At least one cluster/thematic evaluation in each of the five regions during the strategic plan life cycle
- Minimum level of investment in evaluation – 3% of the total plan/programme budget
- Impartiality and adherence to UNEG norms and standards
- Decentralized evaluation function as a shared function but offices remain accountable for the evaluation of their programmes



The assessment covers approved Strategic Notes and Annual Work Plans adopted between 2014- 2016 and Annual Reports prepared by all field offices for the period 2013- 2015.

The central thrust and main purpose of this global evaluation plan is to foster coherence and synergies while maintaining the credibility and quality of evaluations commissioned at different levels. The plan provides a cogent picture of all decentralized evaluations in 2017 including essential information such as evaluation theme, timeline, and indicative budget by region and thematic areas. Owing to their expansive scope, limited quantity and relatively higher costs, corporate evaluations are not included in the analysis. However, to yield maximum synergy, the plan should be implemented in conjunction with the Corporate Evaluation Plan (2014-2017).

Moving forward, the Independent Evaluation Office (IEO), in collaboration with regional, country and HQ divisions, will systematically use the plan to facilitate better coherence and track implementation of planned evaluations.

Since 2013, 82 countries have been included in evaluations, with each country included in an average of 2.6 evaluations each (i.e. biennially).

Highlights – 2017 Planned Evaluations

1. Number and type of planned evaluations (N=62)

While shift towards more programme and high level evaluations has been noted (9% increase from previous year), project evaluations continue to dominate planned evaluations by country offices (37%).

Altogether, the 2017 plan comprises 62 evaluations of various types, including 14 evaluations (23%) rolled over from 2016. The plan includes 8 (13%) regional thematic evaluations⁴, 14 (23%) country portfolio evaluations⁵, 13 (21%) programme evaluations⁶, 4 (6%) UN Joint evaluations⁷, and 23 (37%) project evaluations. Regionally, East and Southern Africa (25%), Arab States (20%), and Asia and the Pacific (17%) and West and Central Africa (17%), regions have the highest percentage of countries with planned evaluations.

More country portfolio evaluations (14) are planned in 2017, representing 19% increase over the previous year. In regional terms, West and Central Africa Region accounts for 43% of the total planned CPEs in 2017 followed by East and Southern Africa with 28%. No CPE is planned in Asia and the Pacific Region. Although few, four joint evaluations are planned in 2017. Furthermore, 11 UNDAF evaluations will be supported by UN Women in Asia and the Pacific and West and Central Africa regions in 2017. Although it shows a 10% drop over the previous year, project evaluations continue to dominate the number of planned evaluations (37%). Project



evaluations are very often donor-driven (planned in accordance with partnership agreements with donors) and funded through non-core resources.

Overall, the total number of planed evaluations in 2017 (62) showed a decline in comparison to annual totals of 66 and 81, respectively in 2015 and 2016. However, some offices do not have an up-to-date evaluation plan or indicated the required resources for evaluations. Further, evaluation plans have not been always posted and updated in the GATE system. Due to this and other factors including unforeseen demand by donors, more evaluations may surface and some will be forgone during course of the year.


2. Thematic coverage of planned evaluations

The coverage and scope of UN Women evaluations is increasing and a quarter of the planned evaluations (26%) cover multiple impact areas under the Strategic Plan 2014-2017.

Evaluations have started to cover multiple impact areas under the Strategic Plan 2014-2017. In 2017, 20% of decentralized evaluations are focusing on women's economic empowerment, 19% on peace, security and humanitarian response and 19% on violence against women. Furthermore, 17% of evaluations cover issues related to women's leadership and participation and 17% on national planning and budgeting. The least covered area is the Normative Framework (8%). Due to the nature of regional and country portfolio evaluations, a quarter of the planned evaluations (26%) cover multiple impact areas. This trend in thematic areas generally mirrors UN Women increased global investment across each area.

3. Indicative resource allocations for planned evaluations

Resource allocations for evaluations tend to be proportionate with the scope of evaluations and scale of interventions. Majority of decentralized evaluations (75%) have a budget of less than \$50,000, with 32% having less than \$25,000.

In majority of the cases, the funding for programme, project and joint evaluations come from non-core resources. The costs of evaluations appeared to be proportionate with the scope of evaluations. 75% of planned evaluations have a budget of less than \$50,000. Only 25% of evaluations have more than \$50,000 allocations. On average, regional thematic evaluations costs around \$69,000; joint and programme evaluations \$50,000; country portfolio evaluations \$42,000; and project evaluations \$18,000⁹.




Figure 5: Allocation of financial resources for individual evaluations

4. Implementation of the Plan

The plan was extracted from a list of evaluative activities approved in the MERPs of country offices, and regional offices. The plan does not include reviews, evaluability assessments and other oversight activities. UN joint evaluations were retained on the list to support UN coherence and joint programming.

Overall, the consolidation of the corporate and decentralized evaluation systems has resulted in remarkable improvement in key evaluation performance indicators including strategic planning of evaluations. Moving forward, the IEO in collaboration with regional, country and HQ divisions will systematically use the plan to facilitate better coherence and tracking implementation of planned evaluations through the Global Evaluation Oversight System (GEOS). The information will also form the basis for the IEO's 2017 annual report on the evaluation function to the Executive Board in June 2018.
