Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 7	GEEW is clearly included in the scope and objectives of the evaluation, it is also included in the evaluation framework indicators (although mainly relating to alignment with GEEW policy rather than examining social norms or structural conditions). GEEW is mainstreamedthroughout the evaluation matrix through specific questions. The methods use a mix of qualitative and quantified approaches, with attention paid to disaggregating responsese from different gender groups in order to triangulate multiple perspectives and interrograte women's empowerment. The findings, conclusions and recommendations all include reference to the specific contributions of the project to outcomes for women. They also discuss the involvement of men as agents of change for GEEW.
