Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 6	Recommendations are supported by the evaluation evidence and reflect a good understanding of the programming context. They are actionable, as they clearly identify the target group for action and are prioritized using a five-star rating system. The report, however, does not clearly describe the process followed in developing the recommendations. It appears as though the report suggests that stakeholders be consulted upon completion of the final report rather than explaining how stakeholders were involved in the development of the recommendations.

Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 7	GEEW is fully integrated into the objectives and scope of the evaluation. However, evaluation questions are not included in the report and the annexes are not retrievable. The evaluation has both a standalone GE/HR criterion and also appears to mainstreams GEEW into selected questions under other criteria. The reports provides a limited overview of the methods – which include participatory processes to include the voice of different stakeholders. Contribution analysis is relevant to identify gender dimensions; but there is limited evidence of participation in the analysis of data. The evaluation findings, conclusions and rtecommendations address both the contributions of the CO the GEEW and include gender-analysis of the design-led approach used by the ofice.
