| Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 7 | The report mentions the gender approach in what it looks as a superficial level (not specifying elements or implications of adopting such approach). It only seems to be partially integrated and the different evaluation elements do not seem to incorporate the gender lens. There are some scattered mentions of Gender considerations in the indicators contained in the evaluation matrix (page 18). The evaluation criteria make reference to the GEEW issues in a very indirect manner. The methodological design does not contain major evidence of including HR&GE as drivers of the approach and methods. There are certain elements making analysis supported by gender and other variables along the last sections of the report. | | | | |
