Executive Feedback on Overall Rating	This evaluation report presents a sound quality in terms of methodology and findings and it meets overall UN Women's requirements for reports. However the quality of the Conclusions and Recommendations sections drastically differs from the rest of the report and should have been more deeply and technically developed.				
PARAMETER 1: OBJECT AND CONTEXT OF THE EVALUATION			PARAMETER 1	Good	
Executive Feedback on Parameter 2	The object of the evaluation is successfully described in the first part of the report. Table 1 in page 12 details the intervention's expected outputs and outcomes and the break-down of the agencies involved in each of them. The context the intervention works in is not developed in a sufficient manner. The theory of change was not presented - retrieved or reconstructed by the evaluators.				
PARAMETER 2: PURPOSE, OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE			PARAMETER 2	Good	
Executive Feedback on Parameter 2	In a very brief manner but the report presents evaluation purpose, objectives and criteria in a clear way. Special mention to the scope that carefully delimited the object of the evaluation in terms of time, space and groups involved in the assessment.				
PARAMETER 3: METHODOLOGY			PARAMETER 3	Good	
Executive Feedback on Parameter 3	According to the report the evaluation was conducted using a mix-methods approach although it is not very clear which quantitative data will be taken into account and its source. The report is very thorough describing each of the methods used. It is interesting to include methods beyond the most common ones (desk review, interviews and focus groups), such as case studies.				
PARAMETER 4: FINDINGS			PARAMETER 4	Good	
Executive Feedback on Parameter 4	The Findings section is very well structured along the evaluation criteria, providing answers to the evaluation questions. Key findings are identified and numbered and relevant pieces of data are also incorporated in boxes in each of the sections. Unintended impacts were also captured and presented in page 36. The evaluation tone leaves doubts about its objectivity (ex. Page viii "...the project made the right choice of interventions and focused on the right groups of people in the right situations").				
PARAMETER 5: CONCLUSIONS AND LESSONS LEARNED			PARAMETER 5	Satisfactory	
Executive Feedback on Parameter 5	Though the Lessons Learned section (3.6 in page 41) is very rich in ideas, the Conclusions section of the report could have been further developed to summarize the findings and elaborate their consequences. Not all the key questions are answered in this section and they do not seem to provide with specific insights to solve the problems found.				

PARAMETER 6:RECOMMENDATIONS		PARAMETER 6	Satisfactory
Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 6	The Recommendations suggested by the evaluation team do not meet the quality of the rest of the report, as they are not sufficiently developed, do not provide with great insights about practical ideas on how to improve the project. Little technical advice on the thematic issues addressed by the project is shown (mostly recommendations addressed to general management level).		
PARAMETER 7: GENDER AND HUMAN RIGHTS		PARAMETER 7	Approaches Requirement
Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 7	The evaluation criteria and questions were set out in the ToRs and cover many aspects of GE and HR issues. These appear to have been applied within the methods and tools. There are some good insights of changes occurring from divergent voices through short case studies. However the analysis and findings could go further to provide more evidence based and in-depth analysis. The scope of analysis sets out the outcome areas which are explicitly focused on gender equality as well as the target groups and stakeholder coverage. Indicators are mixed - some are on women only targets, others which are e.g. % of community do not disaggregate. There is some gender analysis within findings, conclusions and recommendations but it is not in sufficient depth or scope.		
PARAMETER 8: THE REPORT STRUCTURE		PARAMETER 8	Good
Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 8	The structure of the report seems rather clear and complete. The executive summary is well synthesized and gives a good overall picture of the content of the report. Relevant annexes have been included such as the evaluation matrix, the composition of the evaluation team, and other complementary information.
